### MEAP Scores are Up

Our MEAP scores became public in the last few weeks and Genesee is doing well. We averaged an 11% increase in our reading and math scores. Our 6th grade math scores are the highest in the county. The scores indicate a steady increase in student achievement. There are many reasons for this success. At the center of these achievements are the teachers and the parents. The teachers use state

based curriculum and a variety of testing information to help determine what students need to learn. We support instruction in many ways. Administrators provide direction and in-services to help teachers enhance their instruction. Secretaries, teacher aides and other support staff help students throughout the day. Community volunteer mentors provide individual help with students who can benefit from their efforts. The cafeteria staff provides free breakfast and lunch everyday. Custodians provide clean environment for

learning. Our transportation department safely brings kids to school each day. Our grant funded before and after school program which has a summer component, provides additional learning opportunities in a fun atmosphere. Our other extra curricular activities help build character and increase academic success. REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH CURRICULUM HEARING  
WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 17, 2010, 6:30 PM

The hearing (#3 of 3) was opened at 6:30 pm. Board members Gary Galbraith, Fred Hinz and Eladio Quintanilla, Superintendent Jeff Rohrer and three (3) guests attended the hearing.

Coordinator Joe Perrera and Linda Schoener, faculty representative, presented detailed information on the proposed reproductive health curriculum for junior high and high school students.

Discussion was held. The committee will submit a request for approval of this curriculum at the March regular business meeting.

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 17, 2010

The meeting was called to order by President Gary Galbraith at 7:00 pm. Trustees Roger Haas and Wayne Blossom were absent; all other Board members were present. Superintendent Jeff Rohrer, Principals Joseph Perrera and Richard Carsten, Special Services Coordinator Kelly Davis, Athletic Director Ken Foyder, Technology/Media Director LaRene Klink, GEA President Charleen McKeever and GESPA President Melissa Coon and (4) guests also attended the meeting.

All in attendance stood for the Pledge of Allegiance and the District Vision Statement.

- . Motion by Eladio Quintanilla, supported by Fred Hinz...to approve the agenda with revision (schedule date for student disciplinary hearing). Motion carried.
- . Motion by Dan Eashoo, supported by Eladio Quintanilla...to approve the minutes of the January 20, 2010 regular business meeting. Motion carried.
- . Motion by Fred Hinz, supported by Dan Eashoo...to approve the January 2010 treasurer report as presented. Motion carried.

**PRESENTATIONS**

- . Secondary Principal introduced Freshman Maegan Hopper who was chosen as the Underclassman of the Month for the month of January 2010.
- . President Galbraith opened the floor for public comment.

**PUBLIC COMMENT**

Mary K Dowell, M.A.P.E. President (Genesee Twp) invited members of the Genesee Board of Education and the school community to serve on a committee to promote the successful passage of a special assessment/mileage election to be held May 4, 2010. The ballot language will propose a taxpayer increase to support the local police and fire departments.

**ACTION ITEMS**

- . In-depth discussion was held on the proposed Resolution to support the creation of the Greater Flint Area Conference (athletic league).
- . Motion by Fred Hinz, supported by Eladio Quintanilla...to postpone action on the Resolution in Support of a Greater Flint Area Conference as presented. This resolution is tabled for action at the March regular business meeting.
- . Motion by Fred Hinz, supported by Eladio Quintanilla...to appoint Treasurer Fred Hinz as district delegate to the GISD Annual Budget Hearing to be held on March 10, 2010 at 7 pm. Secretary Dan Eashoo will serve as alternate. Motion carried.
- . A Student Disciplinary Hearing is scheduled to be held on Tuesday, February 23, 2010 at 5:30 pm in the Office of the Superintendent. The Board Policy Development Meeting will follow at 6:00 pm.
- . In-depth discussion was held regarding which School of Choice plan to follow for the 2010-11 school year. The district has two options: (1) the Genesee Intermediate School District Collaborative School of Choice plan or (2) to follow the guidelines of the Michigan Department of Education Schools of Choice program. This issue will be placed on the agenda for action at the March 17, 2010 regular business meeting.
- . Linda Schoener, member of the Reproductive Health Committee, indicates the committee will seek approval of the proposed curriculum that targets students in the junior high and high school levels. The curriculum was presented for

review and discussion (02.17.10 at 6:30 pm) by committee members Linda Schoener and Principal Joseph Perrera. The request will be presented at the March regular business meeting.

**SUPERINTENDENT REPORTS**

- . Superintendent Rohrer reported the Governor has proposed retirement incentives to public school employees should they retire before October 1, 2010. Updated information will be presented at the March regular business meeting.
- . Superintendent Rohrer reported replacement Xerox machines would be delivered within the week. The new agreement will reflect a savings of approximately \$17,000 per year.
- . Candidates for the May 4, 2010 annual election are incumbent Fred Hinz, Steven Elkins and Matt Newcomb.
- . The Genesee Promise Scholarship bylaws are near completion.
