Genesee Diplomas for pre- 1961 10th grade graduates.

The GHS class of 2010 will be the 50th high school graduating class of the Genesee School District. Although Genesee has had a school district since the 1800's, until 1961 the school only served students through 10th grade. Genesee students had to complete the requirements for a diploma at another school district. In the 1960-61 school year, 11th and 12th grades were added to the school. As part of our 50th graduating class celebration, the district is offering an honorary Genesee High School

diploma to any former student who completed 10th grade prior to 1961 and went on to finish high school somewhere else. The diplomas would be presented in a short ceremony on May 31, 2010 (Memorial Day). Former students, who meet the criteria, interested in receiving a diploma should contact Jill in the Superintendent's office at 810-591-1650 to obtain a request form.

School of Choice option for students

Part of our school district plan to reach our vision is to maintain a student population of 900 students. Due to the economic situation in

Michigan and Genesee County, the Genesee School District and other districts have seen a reduction in student population. In the past several years, the opportunities for students who live outside our district and who want to attend Genesee have been limited. At the March Board meeting the school board will make an important decision regarding school of choice. The board will vote on a resolution to move our district to an open school of choice enrollment for next year. If the resolution passes, we will open our enrollment to students regardless of their residence. We have

the capacity to accept new students. We have much to offer families who are considering Genesee. We are a small town community school that can meet the needs of all students. We offer a wide range of opportunities. Students can be involved in sports, music, clubs and other activities. Our test scores are good and improving. At one grade level we have the top MEAP score in the county. A high percentage of our students go on to college. We have great sports and music facilities. MME Spring 2010 Student Reminders

Here are some reminders that will help you do your best on the Spring 2010 Michigan Merit Examination.

Test Schedule:

MME Day 1 – ACT Plus Writing – March 9, 2010 – 7:40 a.m. Students report to testing rooms. Testing will be from 7:45 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. Students are dismissed to go home after testing.

MME Day 2 – WorkKeys – March 10, 2010 7:40 a.m. Students report to testing rooms. Testing will be from 7:45 – 10:45 a.m. Students are dismissed to go home after testing.

MME Day 3 – Michigan Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies – March 11, 7:40 a.m. Students report to testing rooms. Testing 7:45 –10:25 a.m. Students are dismissed to go home after testing.

Plan to arrive at school no later than 7:35 a.m. on each test day. If you arrive after testing has started, you will **not** be admitted to the testing room.

WHAT TO BRING

Two soft-lead No. 2 pencils with good erasers

(Use of pens, colored pencils, or highlighters is **not** permitted.)

Acceptable photo ID – must meet the following criteria:

Examples: driver's license, passport, school ID

Current (**not** expired)

Includes your first and last names

Issued by school, employer, or government agency

Current photo clearly recognizable

A calculator for mathematics assessments only (optional)

If you use a calculator, be sure to bring a calculator that you are comfortable using, along with fresh batteries. Check the Prohibited Calculator List at www.act.org to make sure that your calculator is permitted for use on the MME mathematics tests.

A watch (if you wish to pace yourself)

Alarms must be turned off.

WHAT NOT TO BRING

Do **not** bring the following items to the test room:

Cell phone, pager, iPod, timer, or other digital/electronic equipment

Use of any device to share or exchange information at any time during testing or during the breaks is a prohibited behavior. If you bring any of these devices to the test room, you will be required to turn the device off and leave it with the Room Supervisor until you are dismissed after testing concludes.

Scratch paper, notes, foreign language or other dictionary (unless used as an approved accommodation).

You may do scratch work in your Test Booklet

Pens, colored pencils, or highlighters

Portable listening or recording device

Camera or other photographic equipment

TIPS TO DO YOUR BEST

Be well rested. Get a good night's sleep the night before each test.

Eat a healthy breakfast each morning.

Make sure you have your picture ID, pencils, and calculator (if you are using one).

Arrive on time. Students will **not** be admitted to the testing room once the Test Booklets have been distributed.

Pace yourself during the test. If you find yourself spending too much time on one question, move on to the next question. Use breaks to eat or drink any snacks you may have brought with you.

No food or drink is allowed in the testing room unless preauthorized due to a medical necessity.

REGULAR BUSINESS MEETING
WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 20, 2010

- The meeting was called to order by President Galbraith at 7:00 pm. Secretary Daniel Eashoo was absent; all other Board members were present. Superintendent Jeff Rohrer, Secondary Principal Richard Carsten, Elementary Principal Joseph Perrera, Technology/Media Director LaRene Klink, GEA President Charleen McKeever, Food Service Director Dona Lovelady and (10) guests also attended the meeting.
- All in attendance stood for the Pledge of Allegiance and the District Vision Statement.
- Motion by Fred Hinz, supported by Eladio Quintanilla to approve the agenda as presented.
- Motion by Roger Haas, supported by Eladio Quintanilla to approve the minutes of the December 15 (Board Policy Development Meeting) and December 16, 2009 (Regular Business Meeting). Motion carried.

PRESENTATIONS

- January is School Board Appreciation Month. Tokens of appreciation were presented to each Board of Education member by the Student Council, National Honor Society and the Genesee Education Association.
- Secondary Principal Richard Carsten introduced the December Students of the Month, Torey Thurlow (Underclassman) and Senior Sean Kirley.
- Through a power presentation, Superintendent Rohrer outlined budget status information and strategic plans to address this issue for the upcoming school year. Discussion included School of Choice options.
- President Galbraith opened the floor for public comment; there was none at that time.

ACTION ITEMS

- Motion by Fred Hinz, supported by Roger Haas to accept the administrative recommendation to approve participation in the Cooperative Bid Resolution for Services as presented. Motion carried.
- In-depth discussion was held regarding the Xerox Plan agreement as presented.
- Motion by Fred Hinz, supported by Eladio Quintanilla...to accept the administrative recommendation to enter into an agreement with Xerox to supply copy machines to the Genesee School District subject to price negotiation. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

- Discussion was held regarding the proposed changes in the GISD Collaborative School of Choice program and how these changes could impact student enrollment should the district choose to participate. Superintendent Rohrer also explained the provisions of State of Michigan Schools of Choice. Discussion was held. Updated information will be presented at the February regular business meeting.

- Area schools are in the process of creating a new athletic league (Flint Area Conference-FAC) that will include teams from the remaining schools of the Big Nine and the current GAC. Discussion was held. More information will be available at the next regular business meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

- Joshua Bolanowski, graduate of the Class of 2009, will be inducted into the Boy Scouts of America Eagle Court of Honor on January 23, 2010. Josh represents local Troop 109.
- A recent article in the Flint Journal highlights the 50th graduating class at Genesee High School (Class of 2010). The district will host an event to commemorate this district milestone. Event details will be announced at a later date.
- Superintendent Rohrer noted a State budget proposal calling for a 5% wage reduction for all public employees (includes school employees). The proposal would also require public employees to pay 20% of all health care premiums and would be placed on the November ballot. He anticipates several proposals to be announced regarding State budget issues. Discussion was held.
- Bylaws of the Genesee Promise Scholarship Program are near completion. This scholarship program will be monitored by the Genesee Community Foundation with an Advisory Board to consist of community and Board of Education members and school personnel. Superintendent Rohrer will provide updated information at the next regular business meeting.
- Two (2) seats are will be available on the Genesee Board of Education effective 06-30-10. Candidates who wish to seek office must file the necessary forms no later than 4 pm, February 9, 2010 at the Genesee County Clerks office. The election date is May 4, 2010.

President Galbraith opened the floor for public comment; there was none.

Motion by Fred Hinz, supported by Eladio Quintanilla to pay the bills. Motion carried.

Motion by Eladio Quintanilla, supported by Wayne Blossom to move to Executive Session at 8:27 pm to discuss the Superintendent Contract and Collective Bargaining. Roll call vote as follows: Haas, yes; Hinz, yes; Blossom, yes; Simons, yes; Quintanilla, yes; Galbraith, yes. Motion carried.

The Board arose from Executive Session at 9:05 pm.
